If your application deems you eligible for an interview, you will be invited to an interview and asked to provide the following supporting documentation. You may only have 7 days' notice of interview, so we encourage you to organise these documents soon.

- You must provide the interview panel with 2-3 Reference Letters written in the past 3 months. They should be a variety of former landlords, people who know you through recent/current employment, recent/current education, or recent/current voluntary/ community work. You must bring letters, not just names of contacts. Bring a copy of each letter for the panel to keep.
- 1 piece of government-issued photo ID (Passport/ leave to remain/permanent residence, Driving Licence, etc) or 1 piece of non-government photo ID and 1 piece of non-photo government ID (birth certificate). Bring originals to show the panel and photocopies for them to keep.
- Proof of Income (Must be wage slips from the most recent 3 months, proof of Housing Benefit/Universal Credit, etc). Bring originals to show the panel and photocopies for them to keep.
- Proof of current/recent address (bank statement, utilities bill, etc). If no fixed address, bring letter from someone who can confirm this. Bring originals to show the panel and photocopies for them to keep

Data protection
